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

### ENTERING AND EDITING TEXT


#### Controls used for text entry:



- To insert a text, move the cursor to a place to enter, and then rotate [DIAL] or push D-pad(11).
- To clear a character, push [CLEAR].
- To consecutively clear characters, continuously hold down [CLEAR].


#### To change the character type:

- 1. When not selecting text, or an entered text is selected, push [QUICK].
- Rotate [DIAL] to select the character type, and then push [ENT].


### HOW TO ENTER TEXT

**Example:** Entering "2m Call" as a Memory name of channel 00 in group 06 (No Category).

#### [MENU] > MEMORY > Memory CH

- 1. Push [MENU].
- 2. Select "MEMORY" on the MENU screen.
- 3. Select "Memory CH."
- 4. Select "(No Category)."
- 5. Select a channel group where the memory channel you want to edit is listed.
- 6. Select a Memory channel.









### TIME SETTING

IC-R15 does not have the function to automatically set the time. We recommend you set the time from the SET mode before operating.

([MENU] > SET > Time Set > Date/Time)

① Set the time if the battery pack has been removed for more than a day.

() CS-R15 PROGRAMMING SOFTWARE (purchase separately) can automatically set the time.

### Section 1 BATTERY CHARGING

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### **Battery information**

#### **♦**Battery life

The approximate battery life (operating time) is 13 hours under the following assumptions:

• External speaker (8 Ω load, at 10% distortion)

**NOTE: BE SURE** to replace the battery pack with a new one approximately five years after purchase, even if it still holds a charge. The material inside the battery cells will become weak after a period of time, even with little use.

The estimated number of times you can charge the pack is between 300 and 500. Even when the pack appears to be fully charged, the operating time of the receiver may become short when:

- Approximately five years have passed since the pack was manufactured.
- The pack has been repeatedly charged.

**TIP:** Keep the battery terminals clean. It's a good idea to clean them occasionally.

#### **♦**Battery icon

The "**m**" battery icon is displayed when the battery pack is attached to the receiver.

### ♦ Capacity of the battery pack

lcon	Battery Status
<b>4</b>	The battery is being charged.
(III)	The battery has sufficient capacity.
	The battery is exhausted a little.
(green)	The battery is nearing exhaustion.
(red)	The battery is almost fully exhausted. (1) Immediately charge the battery pack. Otherwise, the icon will soon start blinking, "LOW BATTERY" will be displayed, and the receiver will automatically turn OFF.

① The battery icon for the BP-293 cannot display the capacity of the alkaline batteries. The battery icon always displays "\_\_\_\_," and it does not reflect the true battery capacity.

### **Charging information**

#### NOTE:


- Before using the receiver for the first time, the battery pack must be fully charged for optimum life and operation.
- BE SURE to turn OFF the receiver while charging. Otherwise, the attached battery pack cannot be charged.

① While charging, the charging icon "

① The icon and "Charging...." disappear when the battery pack is fully charged.

#### ♦ Charging with a USB cable

You can charge the battery pack with a USB cable (Type-C) while operating the receiver.



#### NOTE:

- **BE SURE** to attach the battery pack to the receiver.
- USB Power Delivery (USB PD) is not supported.
- You may not be able to charge:
  - Depending on your USB cable or power adapter.
  - When using a USB hub or connecting to a low output USB port.
- Charging time may differ, depending on the USB port.
- The S-meter may appear, or the noise may occur, due to the influence of the USB power supply's noise. In that case, unplug the USB cable to disconnect the receiver from the USB power supply.

#### TIP:

- When a USB cable is connected, the charging is stopped when the battery is fully charged. After that, the charging will resume when a certain amount of capacity is consumed while connecting the USB cable.
- You can change the operation when the receiver is connected to a PC through a USB cable.
   ([MENU] > SET > Function > USB Connect)

### Charging with the BC-223 optional rapid charger

The optional BC-223 rapidly charges a battery pack.

① When about 90% of the battery capacity is charged, the BC-223 stops charging, and the charging indicator lights green. Therefore, the battery life will be a little shorter than when charging with the receiver.

#### Approximate charging time: 4 hours


① This is the time when the battery is exhausted, and charging with the receiver power off.

The following item is required.

- BC-123S (L-shaped type plug)
- (A different type, or no power adapter is supplied, depending on the charger versions.)

#### CHARGING NOTE:

- not manufactured or approved by Icom.
- · CAUTION: DO NOT connect anything to the [USB] port on the side of the receiver when placing the receiver to the rapid charger. This may cause the charger's malfunction. If the charging indicator blinks orange, disconnect the power adapter from the charger, and then reconnect it.
- BE SURE to turn OFF the receiver. When the receiver power cannot be turned OFF because of battery exhaustion, detach the battery pack from the receiver. Then charge the battery pack by itself.
- The BC-223 rapid charger can only charge the BP-287 Li-ion battery pack. Other types of rechargeable batteries, Ni-Cd or Ni-MH, cannot be charged.
- · If the charging indicator blinks orange, there may be a problem with the battery pack or charger. Contact your dealer if you have problems charging a new battery pack.




- · Lights orange: While charging
- · Lights green: Charging is completed.
- · Blinks orange: A charging error has occurred.

### About the optional battery case

The BP-293 uses three AA (LR6) size alkaline batteries.

- 1. Remove the battery case top, as shown below.
- 2. Install three AA (LR6) size alkaline batteries.
  ① Install only alkaline batteries.
  ① BE SURE to observe the correct polarity.
- 3. Attach the battery case.



#### **BATTERIES CAUTIONS:**

- When installing batteries, confirm that they are all the same brand, type, and capacity. **DO NOT** mix new and old batteries.
- **DO NOT** incinerate used battery cells since the internal battery gas may cause them to rupture.
- DO NOT expose a detached battery case to water. If the battery case gets wet, BE SURE to wipe it dry before using it.
- **DO NOT** use batteries whose insulated covering is damaged.
- Keep the battery terminals clean. It's a good idea to clean them occasionally.
- Remove the alkaline batteries when the battery case is not used. Otherwise, the installed alkaline batteries will be exhausted due to the built-in stepup converter.

**TIP:** The batteries may seem to have low capacity when used in low temperatures. Keep the batteries warm in this case.

#### ♦ About the battery replacement

When the alkaline batteries are almost exhausted, "LOW BATTERY" is displayed, and the battery icon blinks. After 10 seconds, the receiver power is automatically turned OFF. In that case, replace all 3 batteries with new alkaline batteries.

① The battery icon for the BP-293 cannot display the capacity of the alkaline batteries. The battery icon always displays "\_\_\_\_," and it does not reflect the true battery capacity.

### About data saved on a microSD card

The following data can be saved onto the card:

- · The receiver's settings
- Voice recorder
- Captured screens
- Memory channel contents
- FM Radio memory
- · Pictures for the Opening Picture setting

### Saving settings onto a microSD card

The Memory channels and settings on the MENU screen can be saved on a microSD card.

Saving data on the card enables you to easily restore the receiver to its previous configuration, even if you perform an All Reset.

You can save settings data as a new file, or you can overwrite a current file.

### Loading the saved files on the microSD card

The saved Memory channels and settings on the MENU screen can be copied to the receiver. This makes it easy to copy Memory channels to another IC-R15 and operate with the same data.

**NOTE:** Saving the current data before loading other data into the receiver is recommended.





### Backing up data saved on the microSD card onto a PC

A backup file enables easy restoration, even if the data on the microSD card is accidentally deleted.

#### ♦ About the microSD card's folder

The folder in the microSD card contains the following:




- IC-R15 folder The folders created in the receiver are contained in this folder.
- Capture folder The captured screen data in the "bmp" or "png" format.
- Csv folder
   Memory channel, FM Radio memory.
- MemoryCh folder The Memory channel contents in the "csv" format.
- RadioMemory folder The FM Radio memory contents in the "csv" format.
- **OpeningPicture folder** The pictures in the "bmp" format that are used for the Opening Picture setting.
- Setting folder The receiver's setting data in the "icf" format.
- Voice folder The recorded Voice recorder audio data folders.
- **YYYYMMDD folder** The recorded Voice recorder audio data is saved in the "wav" format.

### ♦ Making a backup file on your PC

Windows 11 is used for these instructions.

- 1. Insert the microSD card into the microSD card drive or a memory card reader on your PC.
- 2. Click the "Open folder to view files" option to access the card.





5. Open a folder to copy a backup file, then rightclick, and then click "i."

**TIP:** When "USB Connect" is set to "SD Card Mode," and the receiver is connected to the PC through a USB data cable, you can directly access the microSD card that is set in the receiver from the PC. ([MENU] > SET > Function > **USB Connect**)

### Importing or exporting a CSV format file

Read this section before importing or exporting a Comma Separated Values (CSV) format file from the microSD card.

- You can import or export the following data:
- Memory CH
- FM Radio Memory

#### ♦ Importing

#### NOTE:

- Before importing, make a backup file of all the receiver's data to the card in case of data loss.
- The receiver cannot display files that have a file name 21 or more characters. If necessary, rename them using 21 characters or less. When exporting CSV format files using the CS-R15, **BE SURE** the names are 21 characters or less.




### About the SD Card mode

When "USB connect" is set to "SD Card Mode," and the receiver is connected to the PC through a USB data cable, you can transfer the files between the microSD card set in the receiver and a PC. You can back up the setting data and recording data saved on the microSD card to a PC, and save the firmware data to the microSD card without inserting or removing it.

#### [MENU] > SET > Function > **USB Connect**

- 1. Connect the receiver to a PC using a USB cable.
- 2. Push [MENU].
- 3. Select "Function" in the "SET" menu.
- 4. Select "USB Connect."



#### 6. Select "YES."



**NOTE:** Before connecting the receiver in the SD Card mode to a PC with a USB cable, a microSD card must be inserted.

① If the microSD card is not inserted, insert it with the receiver turned OFF, and then reconnect the USB cable.

**TIP:** In the SD Card mode, the receiver works not as a receiver but as a data storage device. It temporarily stops some functions as follows:

- Stops recording
- Disconnects a Bluetooth device
- Disables the Auto Power OFF function

#### To exit the SD Card mode

① This instruction manual is based on Windows 11.

- 1. Click "," in the task tray.
- 2. Click "Eject Device."
- 3. After "Safe to Remove Hardware" is displayed, remove the USB cable from the PC.

### Check the free space and the recording time on the microSD card

### MEMORY OPERATION

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### **General description**

The Memory mode enables you to quickly select often-used frequencies, modes, and other parameters. While operating in the Memory mode, you can temporarily change the operating frequency, mode, and so on without overwriting the memory channel contents.

Group	Memory channel	Descriptions
00 to 99	00 to 99	Regular memory channels. Up to 2000 channels can be separately stored in the 100 memory channel groups.

### ♦ Memory channel content

The following information can be entered into the Memory channels:

- Name
- · Operating frequency
- Tuning step
- Operating mode
- Duplex direction (DUP+/DUP-)
- Frequency offset
- Scan skip setting
- AF filter
- Favorite
- Subaudible tone encoder, tone squelch, or DTCS squelch ON/OFF\*
- Subaudible tone frequency, tone squelch frequency, or DTCS code with polarity\*
- VSC\*

\* For only FM/FM-N.

**NOTE:** Memory content may be accidentally cleared by static electricity, electric transients, and other causes. In addition, it may be cleared by a malfunction or during repairs. Therefore, we recommend that you backup the Memory content or save it onto a microSD card\* or a PC. \*User supplied


The CS-R15 PROGRAMMING SOFTWARE can also be used to backup your memory content. See its instruction manual for details.

### **MEMORY** screen

On the MEMORY screen, you can easily manage the Memory channel content.



#### Tree view of the MEMORY screen (Example)



- \*1 Automatically writes when a signal is received.

#### Scanning in the Dualwatch operation

The Dualwatch function simultaneously monitors 2 frequencies.

For example, if you are receiving in the AM mode on one band and scanning on the other band, you may hear noise due to voltage fluctuations when switching frequencies because the 2 receiving circuits share the antenna on the IC-R15. However, this is not a receiver malfunction.

# Scan Type

Scanning is a versatile function that can automatically search for signals. A scan makes it easier to locate stations to contact or listen to, or to skip unwanted channels or frequencies.

# **♦VFO scan**

The VFO scan searches for signals within the specified frequency range.

- Program scan (P00 ~ P24): Repeatedly scans the selected Program Scan range.
- Program Link (P-LINK0 ~ 9): Sequentially scans the Program Scan ranges. The links are set on the MENU screen.
- Band: Repeatedly scans the frequency band.
- All bands: Repeatedly scans all bands.
- Auto MW: When a signal is received during a VFO scan, the frequency is automatically stored in an Auto Memory Write channel group (Auto MW CH 000 ~ 199).

#### ♦ Memory scan

The Memory scan searches for signals on the preregistered memory channels.

- Favorite: Sequentially searches through all Favorite memory channels.
- Current Group:
  - Scans the memory channels that are entered in the same group that is currently selected.
- Group Link: Sequentially scans the memory groups that are set to link on the MENU screen.
- · Category/Group:
  - Scans the memory channels in the selected category group.
- ALL: Repeatedly scans all memory channels.


# ♦ Tone scan

The Tone scan searches for signals with tone frequencies or DTCS codes from stations using the Tone Squelch function.

① A Tone scan is usable for only FM/FM-N in the VFO or Memory scan.

# Starting or canceling the scan

- ① Set the VFO mode or memory mode before starting the scan.
- 1. Push [SCAN].
  - Opens the Scan Type Select window.
  - ① If you hold down [SCAN] for 1 second, the last selected scan starts.
- 2. Select a scan type.



- The scan starts.
- In the VFO mode, the decimal point and the selected Scan Type icon blink.
- In the Memory mode, the decimal point and the Memory icon blink.
- ① When receiving a signal, the S-meter displays the received signal strength.
- ① Rotate [DIAL] to change the scanning direction.
- 3. Push [CLEAR] to cancel the scan.

# **About Scans**

#### ♦[DIAL] operation during a scan

- Rotate [DIAL] to change the scan direction during a scan.
- When the scan is paused, rotate [DIAL] to resume the scan.

# ♦ Squelch setting for a scan

You can change the squelch level to suit your operating needs. Set the squelch level to open the squelch, according to the received signal strength.

① During a scan, rotate [DIAL] while holding down [SQL] to adjust the squelch level. The scan resumes after adjusting.

# ♦ Tuning step for a VFO scan

The selected tuning step is applied to the scan. For a Program scan or Program Link scan, set the tuning step in the Program Scan Edge ranges (Program Scan Edge).

# **♦** Scan Skip function

The skip function speeds up scanning by not scanning those frequencies set as skip channels. ① These settings can be separately set to A band and B band.

#### In the VFO mode

The frequencies that are set as "PSKIP" are skipped during a scan. (p. 4-8)

#### In the Memory mode

The frequencies that are set as skip channels "PSKIP" and "SKIP" are not scanned. (p. 4-8)

① You must enter 2 or more Memory channels to start a memory scan.

# ♦ Storing the skip frequencies

You can skip unnecessary frequencies during a scan. While a scan is paused, and if you want to skip the frequency, you can store it into the Skip channels group (SKIP CH:  $00 \sim 99$ ) as a Skip channel (PSKIP). The Scan Skip function speeds up a scan.

- 1. While a VFO scan is paused, push [SKIP].
- 2. Select "Add to SKIP MR Group."



- The window, as shown above, is displayed.
- Two short beeps sound.
- The frequency is stored in the Skip channels group.
- After storing, the scan resumes.
- If there is no blank channel, an error beep sounds, and the frequency is not stored.

# ♦ Setting the skip channel

You can set or clear a Skip Channel setting. The channels that are set as a Skip channel are skipped during a scan.

#### **♦** Temporary skip function

- Sets the frequency or Memory channel as a Skip Frequency or Channel.
- · The scan automatically resumes.

#### TIP:

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# **Basic operation**

## ♦ Description

You can listen to FM Radio broadcasts.

While using the Dualwatch function, you can still listen to the FM Radio only on the A band.

Up to 500 FM Radio Memory channels can be separately stored in 26 groups for easy memory management.

If you only want to listen to FM Radio, set to the single band display or select "FM Radio" in "Simple Mode" on the MENU screen.

**TIP:** The FM Radio Memory channel contents described in this manual may differ from your receiver's preloaded contents.


#### The frequency range for the FM Radio:

FM: 76.0 MHz\* to 108.0 MHz

\* The usable frequency range may differ, depending on the receiver's version.

# ♦ Turning ON the FM Radio

- 1. Push [QUICK].
- 2. Select "<<FM Radio Mode>>."
  - Returns to the Standby screen, and "FM RADIO" is displayed.



① To turn OFF FM Radio, push [QUICK], and then select "<<Exit FM Radio Mode>>."

# ♦ Selecting the FM Radio mode

- 1. In the FM Radio mode, push [MR] to toggle between the Tuning or the Memory modes.

## ♦ Setting a squelch level

The squelch enables the audio to be heard only while receiving a signal that is stronger than the set level. A higher squelch level blocks weak signals, which enables you to receive only stronger signals. A lower level enables you to hear weak signals.

• While holding down [SQL], rotate [DIAL] to select the squelch level.

#### (i) Information

- Options: "OPEN," "AUTO" (default), and "LEVEL 1" ~ "LEVEL 3"
- "LEVEL 1" is loose squelch (for weak signals), and "LEVEL 3" is tight squelch (for strong signals).
- "AUTO" is an automatic level adjustment using a noise pulse counting system.
- "OPEN" is the continuously open setting.

# ♦ Using the Monitor function

The Monitor function is used to listen to weak signals without changing the squelch setting.

While holding down [SQL], you can hear weak signals on the frequency.

The squelch opens.



The first segment blinks.

**TIP:** You can set the Monitor Hold function on the MENU screen. The receiver opens or closes the squelch each time you push [SQL]. ([MENU] > SET > Function > **Monitor**)

# **Recording audio**

You can record the received audio on the MAIN and SUB bands.

#### NOTE:

- You must insert a microSD card into the receiver before recording audio.
- The recording function is continuously ON, even if the receiver is turned OFF, and then ON again.

#### To start recording

• Hold down [•REC] for 1 second.




• "Recording started." is displayed.

#### To stop recording

• Hold down [•REC] for 1 second again.



• "Recording stopped." is briefly displayed, and the audio recording stops.



#### Information

- The function records the audio on both the MAIN and SUB bands when the Dualwatch function is ON.
- The function records the audio on the displayed band (A or B), when a single band display is selected.
- The recording pauses while no signal is received and resumes when a signal is received again.
- The recording continues until you manually stop recording or the card becomes full.

#### TIP:

When "RX REC Condition" is set to "Always," the recording is automatically started. In that case, recording continues, even when no signal is received.\* (p. 6-8) ([MENU] > RECORD > Recorder Set > RX REC Condition)
 \* The recorded file contains no sound.
 You can select to record the received audio from only the MAIN band or both the MAIN and SUB bands. (p. 6-8)

#### [MENU] > RECORD > Recorder Set > **RX REC Condition**

Selects whether or not the squelch status affects the received audio recording.

- · Squelch Auto: The receiver records the audio only when a signal is received (the squelch is opened). When the squelch closes while recording, the recording will continue for 2 seconds and then pause.

#### **File Split**

Turns the File Split function ON or OFF.

- ON: During recording, if reception or squelch status\* (open and close) is changed, a new file is automatically created in the same folder, and the audio is saved into a new file. \* Only when "REC Condition" is set to "Squelch Auto."







#### Auto Power OFF

(Default: OFF)

#### [MENU] > SET > Function > Auto Power OFF

Selects whether or not to automatically turn OFF the receiver after inactivity for this set period of time.







- Hold: Push [SQL] momentarily to monitor the frequency and push momentarily again to cancel it.

Dial Speed-UP

(Default: ON)

#### [MENU] > SET > Function > Dial Speed-UP

Turns the Dial Speed Acceleration ON or OFF. The acceleration automatically increases the tuning speed when you rapidly rotate [DIAL].

- OFF: Turns OFF the function.
- ON: Turns ON the function.

#### Key Lock

(Default: Normal)

#### [MENU] > SET > Function > Key Lock

Selects the key lock type when the Key Lock function is ON.

**NOTE:** Regardless of the setting, you can still use [ $\bigcirc$ ] and [**\square O**] even if the Key Lock function is ON.

- Normal: All keys and dials, except [SQL] and [VOL] are locked.
- No SQL: All keys and dials, except [SQL], are locked.
- No VOL: All keys and dials, except [VOL], are locked.
- ALL: All keys and dials are locked.

Frequency Selection Range	(Default: All bands)
[MENU] > SET > Function >	

#### Frequency Selection Range

Sets whether the frequency range selected by rotating [DIAL] is fixed within the receive band.

① This setting does not affect the scan.

- In-band: When you change the frequency on the band edge, the top or bottom frequency in the displayed band is selected.
  - ① To change the receive band, select "Select Band" from the Quick menu or push D-pad(≒).

#### Memory Selection Range (Default: All Groups)

#### [MENU] > SET > Function > Memory Selection Range

Sets whether the memory channel range selected by rotating [DIAL] is fixed within a group or category.

When you change the memory channel, you can select from the displayed category.

- All Groups: When you change the memory channel, you can select from all channels.
- This setting does not affect the scan.

#### CI-V Address

(Default: B0)

#### [MENU] > SET > Function > CI-V > CI-V Address

Sets the CI-V address in hexadecimal code.

① To distinguish devices, each CI-V receiver or transceiver has its own Icom standard address. "B0" is the default address of the IC-R15. When 2 or more IC-R15 are simultaneously controlled by a PC, set a different address for each receiver between 02 and DF (hexadecimal).

**CI-V Baud Rate (SP Jack)** 

(Default: Auto)

# [MENU] > SET > Function > CI-V > CI-V Baud Rate (SP Jack)

Sets the CI-V data transfer speed when remotely controlling the receiver through the  $[\cap]$  jack, to 4800, 9600, 19200 bps, or Auto. When "Auto" is selected, the baud rate is automatically set according to the controller's data rate.

#### **CI-V Transceive**

(Default: OFF)

#### [MENU] > SET > Function > CI-V > CI-V Transceive

Turns the Transceive function ON or OFF.

- OFF: The status is not output.
- ON: The status is output. When you change a receiver setting, the same change is automatically set on other connected transceivers or receivers, and vice versa.

#### CI-V Echo Back (USB Jack)

(Default: OFF)

#### [MENU] > SET > Function > CI-V Echo Back (USB Jack)

Sets whether or not to turn the Data Echo Back function ON or OFF, when remotely controlling the IC-R15 through the [USB] CI-V port.

- OFF: Turns OFF the function.
- ON: Turns ON the function.

#### CI-V USB→REMOTE Transceive Address (Default: 00)

# [MENU] > SET > Function > CI-V > CI-V USB→REMOTE Transceive Address

If you remotely operate your receiver through a USB cable when "CI-V Transceive" is set to ON, the devices in the same system are also externally controlled through the  $[\Omega]$  jack.

To prohibit the external control of an Icom receiver, set this value to other than "00."

The control signal is output from the  $[\Omega]$  jack.

Select an address between 00 and DF (hexadecimal).

#### USB Connect

#### [MENU] > SET > Function > USB Connect

Selects the mode when connecting the receiver to a PC with a USB cable.

Charge Only:

You can only charge the receiver using a USB cable.

Serialport:

You can program and remotely control the receiver using the CI-V commands.

① You need to install the USB driver.

- When a PC is connected, the USB connection indicator I is displayed on the receiver.
- SD Card Mode:

You can transfer the files between the inserted microSD card and a PC, using a USB cable. ① A confirmation dialog is displayed. (p. 2-9)

#### NOTE:

- Use a data communication compatible USB cable when "Serialport" or "SD Card Mode" is selected.
- While in the SD Card Mode, the receiver works not as a receiver but as a data storage device. It temporarily stops recording and logging.

#### [MENU] > SET > Function > Heterodyne

Selects the 1st Local Oscillator frequency. Depending on a combination of the 2 operating frequencies in the Dualwatch mode, the receiver might generate a spurious signal on a specific receive frequency. This may cause the S-meter to fluctuate, even when no signal is received, for example. If this occurs, the Heterodyne function may help. The Heterodyne function shifts the 1st Local Oscillator frequency to the opposite side of the signal to change the frequency combination.

#### Screen Capture [PWR] Key (Default: OFF)

#### [MENU] > SET > Function > Screen Capture [PWR] Key

Assigns the Screen Capture function to [也].

- OFF: [也] does not act as the Screen Capture key.
- ON: Pushing [b] captures the receiver display onto a microSD card.

#### Screen Capture File Type (Default: BMP)

[MENU] > SET > Function > Screen Capture File Type

Sets the file format for the Screen Capture function to PNG or BMP.

#### (Default: Auto (DC IN:ON))

#### [MENU] > SET > Display > Backlight

Selects an option for the receiver backlight.

- OFF: The backlight does not light.
- ON: The backlight lights continuously.
- Auto: The backlight lights when you push a key or rotate [DIAL], and reduces the brightness\* after the set period of time in "Backlight Timer."
- Auto (DC IN:ON):
   The backlight live
  - The backlight lights when you push a key or rotate [DIAL], and reduces the brightness\* after the set period of time in "Backlight Timer."
    When an external DC power source is connected, lights continuously.
- \* When "Dim Screen" is set to "OFF," the backlight goes out after the set period of time in "Backlight Timer."

#### **Backlight Timer**

(Default: 10sec)

#### [MENU] > SET > Display > **Backlight Timer**

Sets the Backlight Timer to 5, 10, or 30 seconds. Depending on the "Backlight" setting, the backlight lights for this set period of time and then automatically reduce the brightness.

When "Dim Screen" is set to "OFF," the backlight goes out after this set period of time.

#### **Brightness**

(Default: 8)

#### [MENU] > SET > Display > Brightness

Sets the LCD backlight brightness level to between 1 (dim) and 8 (bright).

#### Dim Screen


(Default: ON)

#### [MENU] > SET > Display > Dim Screen

Selects whether or not to automatically reduce the backlight brightness.

- OFF: The backlight immediately goes out after the set period of time in the "Backlight Timer."
- ON: The backlight brightness automatically changes to the "Brightness (Dim)" level after the set period of time in "Backlight Timer" and goes out after the set period of time in "Dim Timer."

- ① You can check the brightness at each level on the "Brightness" screen.

#### Display

#### RX Backlight (Except Radio)

(Default: OFF)

#### [MENU] > SET > Display > RX Backlight (Except Radio)

Turns the RX Backlight function ON or OFF. This function turns ON the backlight when receiving a signal other than FM radio.

- OFF: Turns OFF the function.
- ON: The backlight automatically lights when receiving a signal other than FM radio.

#### NOTE:

- The function is enabled only when the "Backlight" is set to "Auto" or "Auto (DC IN: ON)." ([MENU] > SET > Display > Backlight)
- The backlight lights even if the function is OFF, when the "Backlight" is set to "ON" or "Auto (DC IN: ON)."
- The backlight automatically turns OFF, according to the "Backlight Timer" and the "Dim Timer" settings.

#### **Scroll Speed**

(Default: Fast)

#### [MENU] > SET > Display > Scroll Speed

Sets the scrolling speed displayed on the screen to "Slow" or "Fast."

#### **Opening Message**

(Default: ON)

(Default: ON)

#### [MENU] > SET > Display > **Opening Message**

Selects whether or not to display the opening message at power ON.

When you set this item to "ON," the Icom logo and the model are displayed.

#### Battery Level (Power ON)

#### [MENU] > SET > Display > **Battery Level (Power ON)**

Selects whether or not to display the battery pack level on the receiver's display at power ON.

- OFF: The battery level is not displayed.
- ON: The battery level is displayed.

#### **Display Type**

(Default: Name)

#### [MENU] > SET > Display > Display Type

Selects a display position of the memory name.

- Freq: The memory name is displayed under the frequency.
- Name: The memory name is displayed above the frequency.

#### Display Language

(Default: English)

#### [MENU] > SET > Display > Display Language

Sets the screen display language to English or Japanese.

This item is displayed only when "System Language" is set to "Japanese."

#### Display

#### System Language

(Default: English)

#### [MENU] > SET > Display > System Language

#### Sets the system language of the receiver.

English: The system language of the receiver is English. Only alphabetical characters (A to Z, a to z, 0 to 9) and symbols (! " # \$ % & ' () \* + , - . / : ; < = > ? @ [\]^\_` { ] > ) can be displayed. If Japanese characters (Kanji, Hiragana, and Katakana) are included, the display shows "=" or " " instead of that

display shows "=" or "\_" instead of that character. In that case, you can only delete "=" or "\_" in the receiver's edit mode.

- Japanese: The system language of the receiver is Japanese. Kanji, Hiragana, and Katakana characters, and the 2-bytes symbols can be displayed. To display such characters in the Menu mode, set "Display Language" to "Japanese."
- ① When this item is set to "English," "Display Language" is not displayed.

When you set the system language of the receiver to Japanese, the receiver has the capability to display both English and Japanese characters. HOWEVER, if you select Japanese, all menu items throughout the receiver system will be displayed in only Japanese characters. There will be no English item names. Unless you are fluent in reading Japanese characters, use this feature with extreme caution. If you have changed the receiver's language to Japanese and do not understand the menu system in the new setting, you will have to change the language back to English by doing a partial reset of the receiver CPU. A partial reset will not clear your memory channel databases.





#### Earphone Mode

(Default: OFF)

#### [MENU] > SET > Sounds > Earphone Mode

Turns the earphone mode ON or OFF.

While in the earphone mode, the audio volume level is automatically adjusted to a comfortable level when the optional earphone is connected to the  $[\cap]$  jack.

#### Beep Level

(Default: 8)

#### [MENU] > SET > Sounds > Beep Level

Sets the beep output level to 0 (OFF) or 1 (minimum)  $\sim$  15 (maximum).

#### **Beep/Vol Level Link**

(Default: OFF)

#### [MENU] > SET > Sounds > Beep/Vol Level Link

Selects whether or not the beep output level can be adjusted by rotating [VOL].

- OFF: The output level is fixed to the level set in "Beep Level."
- ON: The output level can be adjusted by rotating [VOL].

#### **Key-Touch Beep**

(Default: ON)

#### [MENU] > SET > Sounds > Key-Touch Beep

Turns the confirmation beep ON or OFF.

- OFF: No beep sounds.

#### Auto Disconnect


The tone squelch opens only when you receive a signal that includes a matching subaudible tone or DTCS code in the FM or FM narrow (FM-N) mode. Also, the reversed tone squelch function mutes the squelch when a signal including a matching subaudible tone or DTCS code.



# **Duplex operation**

The Duplex operation shifts the transmit frequency up or down from the receive frequency by an offset. You can receive communication that uses different frequencies for transmitting and receiving (Duplex), by setting the frequency offset and shift direction. While the [SQL] (monitor) key is held down, the displayed frequency automatically changes to the transceiver transmit frequency.

When the Duplex direction is set to "DUP+," the transmit frequency shifts up from the receive frequency by the offset amount.


When the Duplex direction is set to "DUP–," the transmit frequency shifts down from the receive frequency by the offset amount.

### ♦ Frequency offset

The receive frequency shifts according to the set frequency offset and direction, while holding down [SQL]. You can set the frequency offset and direction in the QUICK menu.

#### **Ship station** RX: 156.250 MHz TX: 160.850 MHz


You need to set the Duplex direction and frequency offset to receive communications as shown above. When the receive frequency of IC-R15 is set to 156.250 MHz, set it to "DUP+."

# Setting the Duplex direction and frequency offset


- 1. Push [QUICK].
- 2. Select "DUP."



- 3. Select the Duplex direction.
  - OFF: Receives simplex communications.
  - DUP-: When you activate the Monitor function, the receive frequency is shifted down by the offset amount and you receive duplex communications.
  - DUP+: When you activate the Monitor function, the receive frequency is shifted up by the offset amount and you receive duplex communications.



4. Rotate [DIAL] to set the offset.



- Set to between 0.000.00 and 159.999.99 MHz.
- The selected tuning step in the VFO mode is used to set the offset.

① 5.000 MHz is set as the default on the 430 MHz band.5. Push [ENTER].

• "D-" or "D+" is displayed.



- 6. Hold down [SQL].
  - The Monitor function is ON. The receive frequency is shifted while [SQL] is hold down.

**TIP:** During a Memory scan, not only the set frequency, but also the offset frequency is scanned if Duplex is set to the channel. ([MENU] > SET > Scan > **DUP Check During MR Scan**)

# Weather channel operation (For only the USA version)

There are 10 weather channels for monitoring the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) weather broadcasts.

The Weather channel and the Weather Alert function are not usable in Simple mode.

### ♦ Selecting a Weather channel

 Push [MR] to enter the Weather Channel mode.
 Pushing [MR] each time toggles the Memory and Weather Channel modes.



2. Rotate [DIAL] to select a Weather channel.
Displays the selected Weather channel number ("WX-01" ~ "WX-10").


### ♦ Weather Alert function

NOAA broadcast stations transmit weather alert tones before important weather announcements. When the Weather Alert function is turned ON, the selected Weather channel is monitored every 5 seconds for an announcement.

When an alert signal is detected, the "ALT" and the WX channel are alternately displayed, and a beep sounds until you change the mode or Weather channel, turn OFF the Weather Alert function, or turn OFF the receiver.

The previously selected (used) Weather channel is checked periodically during standby, or while scanning.

- 1. Push [QUICK].
- 2. Select "Weather Alert."



3. Select "ON."





• Turns ON the Weather Alert function, and "WX" is displayed.

# **Screen Capture function**

You can capture the receiver display onto a microSD card. Most of the screens used in this manual are captured using this function.

However, some displays cannot be captured.





# Cloning

The receiver has a data cloning capability. This function is useful when you want to copy all of the settings and entered contents from one IC-R15 to another. This section describes the cloning method using a microSD card.



# Step 2. Remove the microSD card from the master receiver, then insert it into the sub receiver.

- 1. Turn OFF the master receiver.
- 2. Remove the microSD card from the master receiver.
- 3. Insert the card into the sub receiver, then turn ON the sub receiver.



#### NOTE:

- Turn OFF the receiver before you insert or remove the microSD card.
- **DO NOT** turn OFF the receiver while saving or loading the setting data. Otherwise, the data may be corrupted or deleted.

# Step 3. Loading the setting data into the sub receiver.

[MENU] > SET > SD Card > Load Setting

See page 2-4 for details.

- ① Recorded voice memories are not included in the cloning data. To play back the master receiver's voice memory, insert the microSD card into a sub receiver, or make a copy onto the sub receiver's microSD card using a PC.
- ① Assumes that the microSD card has already been inserted into the receiver.

**TIP:** The setting data is saved in the "icf" file format that is used in the CS-R15 PROGRAMMING SOFTWARE (purchase separately). When the saved data on a card is copied to a PC, you can edit it with the programming software.

For details, refer to the CS-R15 instructions that comes with the software.

# Resetting

Occasionally, erroneous information may be displayed. This may be caused by static electricity or by other factors.

If this problem occurs, turn OFF the receiver. After waiting a few seconds, turn ON the receiver again. If the problem still exists, perform a **Partial reset**. If the problem still exists after performing a Partial reset, perform an **All reset**.

### ♦ Partial Reset

A Partial Reset resets the operating settings to their defaults without clearing the following:

- Memory Channel contents
- Radio Memory contents
- Scan Edge contents
- Opening picture

### **♦**About updating the firmware

You can update the receiver's firmware using a microSD card. Updating the firmware adds new functions and/or improves performance parameters. You can download the latest firmware from the Icom website.

**IMPORTANT:** To update the firmware, first format your microSD card using the receiver. Then, copy the downloaded firmware data from your PC into the "IC-R15" folder on the card.


# Updating the firmware

**CAUTION: NEVER** turn OFF the receiver while updating the firmware. If you turn OFF the receiver, or if a power failure occurs while updating, the receiver firmware may be damaged, and if so, you will have to send the receiver back to the nearest lcom distributor for repair. This type of repair is out of warranty, even if the receiver warranty period is still valid.

#### **Recommendation!**

Fully charging the battery pack before starting the firmware update is strongly recommended. This is to avoid failure during the update, caused by an unexpected power failure.

1. Copy the downloaded firmware data into the "IC-R15" folder onto a microSD card.






